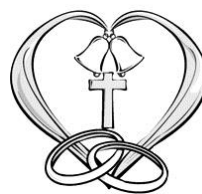

Greetings from St. Mary's School

I hope your June is off to a great start! St. Mary's School is up and running with the **Summer Enrichment** classes that started June 1st. In our first week, students studied critters of all sorts that lead to a variety of learning activities. Each day, students arrive by 8:30 a.m. and begin the day together. Then, they break up into small groups and rotate through 3 centers where they apply math, reading and other **academic concepts** to their topics. Mid-point through the morning, a much-deserved break with snack and a little exercise time is taken before completing the morning session; departure time is 11:30 a.m.

We have 3 more 1-week sessions planned for students entering grades 1st to 7th in the 2015-16 school year. The classes are free, but seating is limited. If you would like to enter your student on a wait list, please feel free to contact the school office at 419-342-2626. The next session begins Monday, June 8th and continues through Friday, June 12th. July sessions are the 6th through the 10th with the final session taking place July 13th through the 17th.

Enrollment for the 2015-16 school year is underway! If you have any questions at all, please contact the school office. Summer hours will vary, but the hours by week are posted on the office door. If you need immediate assistance, you are always welcome to contact by on my cell phone which is 419-631-2449.

It's not too late to apply for scholarships & tuition assistance. Ed Choice Expansion is a school choice initiative designed for ALL families who meet financial eligibility guidelines to be able to attend a private school of choice. This is a full tuition scholarship for students entering grades k, 1, 2. Each year the scholarship adds grade level for eligibility, this year 2nd grade has been added!

We offer the Leap of Faith grant for parish families who wish to transfer to St. Mary's. This is a \$1500 grant covering \$1000 of tuition in year one, then \$500 toward tuition in year two. Among other tuition assistance opportunities, we have a referral program that allows a 20% discount for families referred to the school by parishioners, existing school families, and employees. If the referring family also has students enrolled, they too receive a 20% tuition discount. For referral cards, please contact the school at 419-342-2626.
