Keep up the deeply Christian Community life that you have lived out for so many decades and God will reward you with the grace needed to live a holy life. Please keep the poor and lonely in your prayers and pray for me too, as I will do the same for you.

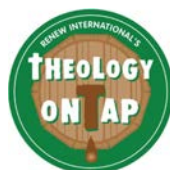
SUMMER SYMPHONY AT ST.

Peter was an apostle of Jesus Christ and the first pope of the Church. After Christ's death and ascension, Peter preached the Gospel to the Gentiles and performed miracles in the name of the God. Eventually, Peter was imprisoned and sentenced to death. He died in Rome, where he was crucified upside down because he declared himself not worthy to die in the same way as Christ. Peter is often depicted holding keys, which symbolize the keys to the kingdom of Heaven.

Peter shares his feast day with St. Paul. Paul was a staunch Jew who persecuted Christians. He converted one day while on the road to Damascus. After his conversion, he became a missionary and took the Gospel to Asia Minor. He made several missionary journeys and spent several years in prison. Like St. Peter, Paul died in Rome. Though the Bible has no record of his death, tradition tells us he was beheaded.

Reflections on the Readings

*Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
taken from St. Joseph Sunday Missal.*

First Reading

Book of Kings 19:16b, 19-21

This narrative tells about a call and the acceptance of the challenge to be a prophet, one who speaks in the name of God. If the prophet speaks up as he should, he knows that evil will resist him—even with a certain degree of violence. The action of throwing one's cloak over another possesses a symbolism similar to that of imposing hands on another. Here it stands for transmitting the charism of prophecy. This tradition is used to introduce a similar challenge of Jesus to his disciples in today's Gospel.

God's word to us in this narrative is clear: Accept the challenge to be a resolute Christian. Make the words of the Responsorial Psalm your own and praise God for your call to be a Christian. You are my inheritance, O Lord.

Second Reading--Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Paul states that salvation comes through faith and not as a result of observing the Mosaic Law. It is a free gift of God. A Christian is free, but Paul qualifies Christian freedom. It is a freedom for love. One may ask: Do we need the ramifications of love and its applications to life situations known as laws? Yes, because of our limited human condition.

If we were so mature in Christ that the compass of love would point out the direction unfaltering, we could do without the laws that explain the ramifications of love in various human situations. Usually we are not. Laws are needed, but their observance should always be guided and motivated by love.

Gospel--Luke 9:51-62

From this passage we learn that Jesus resolutely accepted the consequences of his preaching of God's kingdom. Renewing society and cleansing it from evil provokes resistance and even violence when the preacher of righteousness attacks an evil power structure, and Jesus requires that same resoluteness from his followers. Putting one's hand to the plow but looking back makes one unfit for the kingdom of God.

How strong is your commitment to Christ, and where are you inclined to take the easy way?
