Dear Friends:

Earlier this week I received the following letter. It is such a beautiful statement of faith from one of our young people that I wanted to share it with you all. May we all be as open to seeing the truth of our faith in our lives!

I wanted to share a story/experience about Deacon Fred that happened this past week while we were on vacation.

My husband had told me the news of his passing on Thursday. Later in the day, I was on my phone looking through Facebook and I saw his obituary come up. My daughter, who is 8, was with me at this time, so I explained to her what happened. She was sad.

Later that evening, we were sitting out at our campsite because my friend told us there was going to be a meteor shower that could start around 10:45 p.m. Everyone else had gone to bed, but we thought we would sit out for awhile and see if we could see anything. In the first 15-20 minutes she saw two little shooting stars, but I must have missed them because I wasn't looking in the right spot and they happen so quickly. About a half hour had gone by and I was getting ready to call it a night. Then we saw the clouds and an unusual cloud formation come across the sky. I said wow, that looks like a man's face and right away she says, "maybe it is Deacon Fred". Right when she said that the biggest shooting star came across the entire sky.....it gave me the chills and we both said wow, that was a sign from God. It is so hard to describe, but this cloud figure actually looked just like his face. It was laying flat down like he was sleeping and my daughter even said it looked like he was snoring.

So, that was really neat, but what was even neater was listening to you in church on Sunday morning and at the very end of mass, you said, "please pray for Deacon Fred that he is in the cloud of witnesses". After mass, she picked up one of his funeral cards and on it, it said, "Eternal rest grant unto him O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him..." I told her when we got back to the car so that she could make the connection and she got a big smile on her face. It was such an amazing experience I can't stop thinking about it. I shared it with my mother-in-law last night and got a little emotional.. He is in the cloud of witnesses.

Reflections on the Readings

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time taken from St. Joseph Sunday Missal.

First Reading--Isaiah 66:18-21

This reading from Third Isaiah rejects all clannishness on the part of the Jewish people. Although they are God's chosen people, this does not mean that others cannot be saved. When the Messiah will establish God's kingdom on earth, people from all over the world will come to Jerusalem to worship. The early Christians saw this vision fulfilled when the Gentiles joined the Church. And it will be fully realized when the Son of Man, Jesus will gather all nations into his own.

It often happens that people who joined the Church at a late age make those born and raised in the family ashamed by being more serious than they are. We should be appreciative, "for steadfast is his kindness toward us, and the fidelity of the Lord endures forever."

Second Reading--Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

"Whom the Lord loves, he disciplines": suffering and pain are part of the human condition. Guided by God, the Hebrew sages searched for some insight into the mystery of both mental and physical pain. "The discipline of God" might be one. It is better to be punished now than later. Suffering, if well accepted, may open our eyes to the real values of life and lead to repentance.

Gospel--Luke 13:22-30

Luke puts a question into the mouth of "someone": "will only a few people be saved?" He answers by placing three parables of our Lord in a row. The first parable is the one about the narrow door. There are a few conditions if we want to be saved. We know them! "Oh, when the Saints go marchin' in...."

The second parable is directed to those who are late. They have not repented in time and miss the boat by their own fault: "Depart from me, all you evildoers!"

The third parable warns Israel not to have pretensions as God's chosen people. Only those who repent, both Jews and Gentiles, will be saved. Constant conversion is part of a Christian life-style!



Slow Down: Back to School Means Sharing the Road Back to School Safety Tips



School days bring congestion: Yellow school buses are picking up their charges, kids on bikes are hurrying to get to school before the bell rings, harried parents are trying to drop their kids off before work.

It's never more important for drivers to slow down and pay attention than when kids are present – especially before and after school.

If You're Dropping Off

Schools often have very specific drop-off procedures for the school year. Make sure you know them for the safety of all kids. More children are hit by cars near schools than at any other location, according to the National Safe Routes to School program. The following apply to all school zones:

- Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and vehicles.
- Don't load or unload children across the street from the school.
- Carpool to reduce the number of vehicles at the school.

Sharing the Road with Young Pedestrians

According to research by the National Safety Council, most of the children who lose their lives in bus-related incidents are 4 to 7 years old, and they're walking. They are hit by the bus, or by a motorist illegally passing a stopped bus. A few precautions go a long way toward keeping children safe:

- Don't block the crosswalk when stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn, forcing pedestrians to go around you; this could put them in the path of moving traffic.
- In a school zone when flashers are blinking, stop and yield to pedestrians crossing the crosswalk or intersection.
- Always stop for a school patrol officer or crossing guard holding up a stop sign.
- Take extra care to look out for children in school zones, near playgrounds and parks, and in all residential areas.
- Don't honk or rev your engine to scare a pedestrian, even if you have the right of way.
- Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians.
- Always use extreme caution to avoid striking pedestrians wherever they may be, no matter who has the right of way.

Sharing the Road with School Buses

If you're driving behind a bus, allow a greater following distance than if you were driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing. It is illegal in all 50 states to pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children.

- Never pass a bus from behind or from either direction if you're on an undivided road – if it is stopped to load or unload children.
- If the yellow or red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop.
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them space to safely enter and exit the bus.
- Be alert; children often are unpredictable, and they tend to ignore hazards and take risks.

Sharing the Road with Bicyclists

On most roads, bicyclists have the same rights and responsibilities as vehicles, but bikes can be hard to see. Children riding bikes create special problems for drivers because usually they are not able to properly determine traffic conditions. The most common cause of collision is a driver turning left in front of a bicyclist.

- When passing a bicyclist, proceed in the same direction slowly, and leave 3 feet between your car and the cyclist.
- When turning left and a bicyclist is approaching in the opposite direction, wait for the rider to pass.
- If you're turning right and a bicyclist is approaching from behind on the right, let the rider go through the intersection first, and always use your turn signals.
- Watch for bike riders turning in front of you without looking or signaling; children especially have a tendency to do this.
- Be extra vigilant in school zones and residential neighborhoods.
- Watch for bikes coming from driveways or behind parked cars.
- Check side mirrors before opening your door.
- By exercising a little extra care and caution, drivers and pedestrians can co-exist safely in school zones.
